## CORE VACCINES

Core vaccines are considered vital to all pets based on risk of exposure, severity of disease or transmissibility to humans.

FOR DOGS: Vaccines for canine parvovirus, distemper, canine hepatitis and rabies are considered core vaccines. Non-core vaccines are given depending on the dog's exposure risk. These include vaccines against Bordetella bronchiseptica (Kennel Cough), Borrelia burgdorferi (Lymes Disease), and Leptospira bacteria.

FOR CATS: Vaccines for panleukopenia (feline distemper), feline calicivirus, feline herpesvirus type I (rhinotracheitis) and rabies are considered core vaccines. Non-core vaccines are given depending on the cat's lifestyle; these include vaccines for feline leukemia virus, Bordetella, Chlamydophila felis.
